

How does this work?

This 5 Step Fluency packet is a perfect way to get your students to reread and work on fluency. Each passage has 5 steps for students to follow as they practice their reading skills.



- I. Time It & Mark It
- Reread at My Own Pace
 - 3. Highlight
 - 4. Silly Read
 - 5. Time It & Mark It



For the first step, you will set a timer and the student will read as much of the passage as possible during the given time. You can decide how much time you would like to give the student. The most common would be I minute, but for some faster readers, this may be too much time. After the time is up, the student will mark where they stopped reading.



The second step is to have the student reread the passage at their own pace. Do NOT set a timer for this portion. The student will read the ENTIRE passage without being timed.



This third step allows the student to go back into the text to work on a particular skill. They will underline or highlight words in the passage for the skill in the box to the right of the passage. This is really just another opportunity for the students to reread the passage while they look for these particular words.



This fourth step is a Silly Read. The student will read in the voice given in the box to the right of the passage.

This is a fun way for students to go back and practice their reading fluency.



The final step is exactly like the first step. Set the timer for the same amount of time that you gave the student on the first read. The student will try to beat his/her place from the first reading of the passage. If they beat it, they will color in the smiley face at the bottom of the page. If they do not beat their time, they will color in the sad face.





Sea Stars

Sea stars live in the ocean. There are about two thousand different species of sea stars. You can find some type of sea star in every ocean of the world, but there are no fresh water species of sea stars. The most common variety of sea stars have five arms, but there are species with up to forty arms. Even though these animals are often called starfish, they are not a type of fish. Sea stars are actually a type of animal called an echinoderm. Sand dollars and sea urchins are also echinoderms. All echinoderms have five body sections. Even sea stars with ten, twenty, or more arms, can still be divided into five equal body sections. Sea stars move through the water using their tiny tube-like feet located on their underside. Their hard upper surface contains tiny spines that help to protect them from predators. If a sea star loses an arm when attacked by a

Indianapolis 500

The Indianapolis 500 is an automobile race that takes place every year in Indianapolis, Indiana at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. It began in 1917, and is held annually during Memorial Day weekend. It is often called "The Greatest

Spectacle in Racing." The track is two and a half miles long. The cars race around the

track two hundred times for a total of five hundred miles. There are many traditions that

take place every year for the Indianapolis 500.

The song, "Back Home Again in Indiana," has been sung before every race since 1946. At the

end of the song, numerous multicolored balloons are released into the sky. The race

Used to begin with the well-known phrase,"Gentlemen, start your engines." This has since

125 "Gentlemen, start your engines." This has since 132 been changed to "Ladies and gentleman, start

139 your engines," with the addition of female
146 racecar drivers. After the completion of the

156 race, it is tradition for the winner to drink a

165 glass of milk. This began in 1936 after the

215 of victory. This trophy has been used, and 219 added to since 1936.



Thomas Edison

Thomas Edison was born on February II, 1847, in Ohio.

He was born into a large family as the last of seven

children. Edison was sick as a child, and lost much of

his hearing due to his illnesses. His family moved to

Michigan when he was young, and Edison attended

school for only three months. He had a lot of

difficulties focusing on his work, and was not doing

well in school, so his mother began homeschooling him.

At the age of twelve, Edison began selling

newspapers to train passengers. He would use his

time on the train to set up experiments in the

baggage car. At one point, he accidentally caused a

fire during one of his experiments, and was kicked

off of the train. Edison continued to work hard

132 141 during his young adult life, and loved to experiment

and invent things. In 1869, he moved to New York

City, and developed his first invention, an improved

stock ticker. With the money from this invention, he

moved to New Jersey, and set up his first laboratory.

He was able to hire employees to help him with all of

his ideas for inventions. Edison is most well known

for inventing the light bulb, even though he was not

218 the first person to invent it. Many earlier inventors

228 had invented lightbulbs, but they would not stay lit for

238 long periods of time, and were not practical for use.

245 Edison's lightbulb lasted longer, and could be

252 produced commercially for a reasonable price. His

261 first successful lightbulb test lasted for a little over


269 thirteen hours. Edison continued to improve on his 276 design. He eventually created the Edison Electric

285 Light Company in New York City. Edison held over





Statue of Liberty

The Statue of Liberty is a statue located on Liberty Island in the New York Harbor. It was a present given to the United States in 1886 from France, and commemorates the Declaration of Independence. It

commemorates the Declaration of Independence. It was designed by the French sculptor, Frederic

Bartholdi. Crews worked long hours every day, seven days a week, for nine years to complete the statue.

The statue was then disassembled into 350 pieces, and shipped to New York. The statue was reconstructed on Bedloe Island, now called Liberty

19 America. Liberty Island is surrounded by water and 129 can only be reached by ferry. The statue is a

139 symbol of freedom, and was meant to be a symbol 148 of welcome at the time for immigrants from other 157 countries. The Statue of Liberty stands 151 feet in

> height, and 305 feet from the ground to the top of the torch. The Statue of Liberty, often called Lady

> Liberty, would wear a size 879 shoe. She has a 35 foot waistline. There are 354 stairs inside of the

205 statue for visitors to reach the statue's crown,

213 where there are twenty-five windows. The Statue 224 of Liberty holds a torch, and a tablet. The date of

231 the American Declaration of Independence, July 4,

240 1776, is inscribed on the tablet. There are stairs
251 1 leading up to the torch, but have been closed to the

260 public since 1916 due to safety concerns. The statue 270 is made of copper, which over time has turned green

280 due to a process called oxidation, or the mixing of metal and water.



Alexander Graham Bell

Alexander Bell was born in Scotland on March 3, 1847.

He did not have the middle name, Graham, when he was born. He always wanted a middle name, so his father gave him one as a birthday gift when he

turned eleven. Alexander was a very curious child.

He was always building things, and trying to figure out how things worked. He was an excellent piano player and loved music. Alexander's mother began

losing her hearing when he was young, which made

him became very interested in sound, and the way

the human voice worked. He worked in various schools for the deaf, and enjoyed doing experiments

117 with sound. He eventually met his wife, Mabel, at one

127 of the schools he worked for. She had been deaf 136 since the age of five after a serious illness.

169 the first telephone. Many other inventors were also 179

working on creating a telephone. He came up with an 189 idea, and in February 1876, he rushed to the patent

198 office with his design for the first telephone. He

213 design. On March 10, 1876, Alexander successfully 222 spoke his first words "Mr. Watson. Come here. I

232 want to see you." over the telephone. He formed the

239 Bell Telephone Company, and continued to improve

246 the telephone. Alexander Graham Bell had many 254

inventions during his life including metal detectors, and 262 devices to find icebergs. When he died, every

271 telephone in the United States was silenced for a 278 short time to honor Alexander Graham Bell.



Mount Rushmore

Mount Rushmore National Memorial is located in

South Dakota. It is a sculpture that is carved into Mount Rushmore with the faces of four former

presidents of the United States. The memorial depicts George Washington, Thomas Jefferson,

Theodore Roosevelt, and Abraham Lincoln. The idea

for the Mount Rushmore National Memorial came from a local historian who wanted to bring more

tourism into South Dakota. The carving began in

October of 1927, and did not get completed until

86 fourteen years later in October of 1941. The original

96 plan was to carve the figures from head to waist, 105 but there was not enough money to continue the

II3 project after the faces were completed. The project

122 cost almost one million dollars to complete as is.

130 Over four hundred workers helped to carve the

140 faces into the side of the mountain. They had to

150 climb over five hundred steps to reach the top each 159 day to work on the project. The workers initially

159 day to work on the project. The workers initially
168 used dynamite to remove the stone, and then used

used dynamite to remove the stone, and then used jackhammers and chisels to add the details to the

jackhammers and chisels to add the details to the faces. Each face is approximately sixty feet tall,

196 which is about the same size as a six story building.
205 The noses are about twenty feet long, their mouths

215 are eighteen feet wide, and the eyes are eleven feet 222 across. Trained mountain climbers help to maintain

222 across. Trained mountain climbers help to maintain 230 Mount Rushmore by cleaning the rock, and sealing

238 any cracks. In 1991, Mount Rushmore celebrated its

245 50th anniversary with a forty million dollar 252 restoration project. It is estimated that between

260 two and three million people visit Mount Rushmore 262 every year.







elephants have small ears that do not reach up over

their necks, unlike African elephants that have very

large ears. Both the male and female African

elephants have tusks, whereas only the male Asian

elephants have tusks. Elephants use their tusks to dig in the ground, and look for food. They can also

use their tusks to dig in search of ground water.

Elephants can drink about fifty gallons of water

every day, and can eat between 200 to 600 pounds

of food. Elephants are herbivores, so they eat grasses, plants, bark, and other vegetation.

Elephants use their trunks to eat. They can pick up

food and bring it to their mouths. They can also

suck up water into their trunks and then pour it into their mouths to drink. Elephants are also very good

swimmers. They can use their trunks as a snorkel

while they swim in deep water. Elephant's trunks are made of muscles, and do not contain any bones.

They will sometimes wave their trunks in the air to smell what is around them. Elephants have padding on the bottom of their feet that allow them to walk

228 silently, despite their large size. They are the only 237 mammal that cannot jump. Elephants do not have any

245 natural predators. Sometimes lions will try to attack 254

weak or young elephants, but will not attempt to 262 attack large adult elephants. The biggest threat to 270
